Doc Crouch Elected District Commander Joy Neher: District Senior Vice President

At the Tenth District Convention held on Sunday 21 June, at Dale City Post 1503, and Department Judge Advocate Lawrence F. Mattera announced that John Lyon Post 3150 was selected as an All-State Post. The designation is limited to approximately the top ten percent of posts in the state. The designation reflects all aspects of Post life including membership, community activities, and other programs. This was the eleventh time in the last thirteen years that the Arlington Post has been so honored.

The District Convention also saw the election of new officers to lead the district in the next year.. C.D. "Doc" Crouch was elected District Commander. Joy Neher was elected District Senior Vice President. In all, ten John Lyon Post and Ladies Auxiliary members were elected and installed or appointed at the convention. Further information can be found in inside.

Judge Advocate Mattera also announced that *The John Lyon Gazette* was awarded runner-up in the recent newsletter competition. And the Post came in second overall in Americanism, and fourth in Community Activities (first in its division).

FROM THE POST COMMANDER





I Know What You Did Last Summer...

And Spring, and Fall, and Winter!

And you deserve to be proud of yourself. Keep up the good work.

As we did last year, the following was compiled from the pages of the Community Activities Book before it was sent to state headquarters for judging. It shows what YOU, the John Lyon member, did all last year.

You ...

(Community Involvement and the Environment:) Marched in the Arlington County Parade in October and picked up litter along Lee Highway in October and March in the Adopt-a-Highway program. Collected and recycled 1200 pounds of aluminum cans --- plus some other metals. And collected about 2600 pounds of cardboard and 200 gallons of cooking oil to be recycled. Planted new plants and shrubs; including those on the doorstep and the new Veterans' Rose. Continuously improved the Post web page. Supported the Post Golf Tournament in August with your organizational skills, or by sponsoring holes, donating prizes, or just playing. Donated \$600 to the Arlington Ladies, a dedicated group of women who ensure that no person is buried alone. They bought a needed small refrigerator for their office spaces.

(Cooperation with Other Organizations:) You donated \$1000 dollars to the World War II Memorial through a VFW matching funds program which provided \$1500 to the memorial. Helped American Legion Post 85 with their special picnic. Donated \$500 to the National Association of Bunco Investigators for their efforts including fraud schemes against senior citizens. Held a Speakers Forum and hosted representatives of WIMSA (Women in Military Service to America) who spoke about the Women's Memorial, the Air Force Memorial Foundation, and the Army Historical Foundation, and donated \$250 to each. Provided information to assist the Ripley County Veterans Service Officer, and twice hosted the "AOL Vets" group who made Post 3150 their reunion home. You provided eight members to the Tenth District staff, including Senior Vice Commander and the first District President from John Lyon Post in 18 years. Also served as the Department POW / MIA Coordinator.

(Aid to Others:) You donated \$1300 to Cancer Research and \$100 to the Northern Virginia Hospice. Distributed Buddy Poppies and collected \$2200 in donations, built a Buddy Poppy Rocket display which earned third place in Department competition; and made 100 Christmas ornaments from 3000 Buddy Poppies and decorated the Post Christmas tree with them. Visited veterans in the VA hospital Nursing Home and brought them fresh fruit baskets, ditty bags consisting white socks and other goodies, 15 audio tape players and 40 books on tape, and lots of seasonal and holiday cheer. Distributed 13 food baskets to young enlisted families at Fort Myer for both their Thanksgiving and Christmas breakfasts and dinners, and hosted those same families with their 40 children at the children's Christmas Party where Santa and Mrs Claus distributed many presents. Donated toys and cash worth \$1500 to Toys for Tots, and donated \$525 to the VFW National Home, including \$200 for their water treatment facility. Collected 750 Campbells, Swanson's, Mrs. Paul's, Pepperidge Farm, and other grocery labels to benefit the VFW National Home.

(School and Church:) You became members of Arlington County's Partners in Education, donated 36 classroom flags and one large school flag to Key Elementary School and participated in their new school dedication ceremonies (picture, next page). Collected \$28,326 in Giant grocery store receipts, and an indeterminate number of Safeway receipts to provide computers and other school equipment to Key Elementary school. Donated \$2150 to Key Elementary School to assist in their developing a youth soccer club league. Donated a needed audio recording system to Bishop O'Connell High School for use in Voice of Democracy and similar competitions. Donated a subscription to VFW magazine to high and middle schools in Arlington County to provide students with some sense of history from those who helped make it.

Tired? There's more...

(Safety:) You placed new EXIT lights in the Post Home. Distributed poison-control “Yuk!” labels to parents of young children. Distributed ribbons for drug-awareness “National Red Ribbon Week”. Supported Arlington County DARE program with \$1000 and judged DARE essays and provided prizes to winners in a ceremony at the Post. Promoted “Back-to-School” and “School’s Out” awareness. Distributed “Women Take Caution” fliers to ladies in Arlington County.

(Americanism:) You participated in ceremonies at the “John Lyon” Memorial in Cherrydale on Memorial Day and Veterans Day. Decorated about 150 graves of members and their families at Arlington National and other local cemeteries on Memorial Day. Observed Flag Day. Observed the U.S. Army birthday. Celebrated Independence Day. Observed the U.S. Coast Guard birthday. Observed the birthday of the U.S. Air Force (and honored the Army Air Corps, and Army Air Force). Distributed “Remember POW/MIA Day” stickers and conducted POW/MIA ceremony. Observed the U.S. Navy birthday and the U.S. Marine Corps birthday. Observed Pearl Harbor Day, the Battle of the Bulge, and celebrated St Patrick’s Day. Attended the 63rd Patriotic Assembly in New York City to mark the birthday of the Statue of Liberty. Noted the Fall of the Berlin Wall. Continued to observe the VFW Centennial year with a wreath-laying at the Spanish-American War Memorial, held ceremonies marking the 85th birthday of the Ladies Auxiliary, and a dinner for the 100th birthday of the VFW. Also donated the book VFW: Our First Century to the Arlington County library. Wore John Lyon tee-shirts and caps around Arlington for a day to show who we were. Observed the John Lyon Post 3150 birthday and the Post 3150 Ladies Auxiliary birthday. And put together and took in a history exhibit covering 65 years of John Lyon Post.

(Youth and VOD): Listened to high school Voice of Democracy entries and selected Post winners, one of which won third place in the Tenth District. Read junior high school entries in the Youth Essay Contest and selected winners. Hosted winners of both contests and their families at an awards ceremony and reception. Honored two AF Junior ROTC cadets with appropriate medals and certificates. Donated \$820 to an Arlington High School girl to attend the prestigious Presidential Classroom program in Washington D.C.

And, otherwise kept the Post and Auxiliary moving along (not included in the Activities Book): Hosted our Early Bird members to dinner, and served Thanksgiving dinner. Cooked and served breakfast for members and neighbors at our Community Breakfasts on the second and fourth Sundays. And other food on other occasions. Washed lots of dishes. And pots and pans. Folded, stapled, and labeled about 560 newsletters every month. Mailed out membership cards and letters. Typed correspondence. Swept the floors, swabbed the counters, cleaned up the restrooms, changed light bulbs, watered the lawn, repaired broken things, and --- endless other little necessary chores to keep John Lyon going. Thanks.

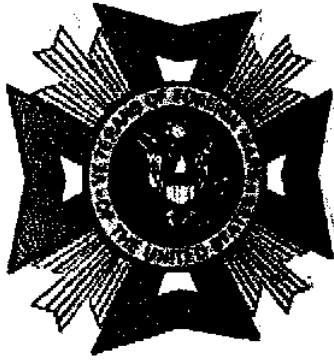

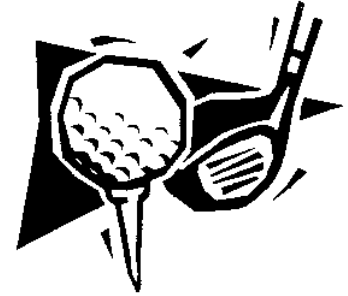
