Jansen, Gibadlo Begin Second Term; State Convention Highlights

Commander Kenneth H Jansen and President Jeanne M. Gibadlo began their second term at VFW Post 3150 and the Ladies Auxiliary about noon on Sunday, 25 June when the new Department Commander and President, respectively, were installed at the conclusion of the Department Convention in Richmond, Virginia. At this same time all Post and Ladies Auxiliary officers of Post and District levels assumed their new offices.

The convention was also notable for the entire John Lyon family as awards were presented during the Thursday evening Awards Ceremony. At the top the of the list were the All State Team "white hats" presented to 1999-2000 Commander Jansen and Quartermaster Richard Hoffman and the Ladies Auxiliary Banner presented to 1999-2000 President Gibadlo. Outgoing Tenth District President Gail Hoffman was honored as the Outstanding District President in the state of Virginia.

Other special awards for 3150 included the first place award for Community Activities for posts of

200 - 500 members. John Lyon received the fourth place overall Community Activities award; the others in the top five have memberships of about 900 -1525 members. Also in the 3150 column: the Clair B. Poff Public Relations Award (Honorable Mention to a single winner) for Outstanding Newsletter; the Richard A. Guager Americanism Award (second place). Also First Place Awards and Citations of Merit to the 3150 Ladies Auxiliary for Best Buddy Poppy Program and Best Youth Essay Program. In other ceremonies, the 3150 Ladies Auxiliary received a first place ribbon for their Buddy Poppy display in the promotions category..

During the banquet on Saturday night, Post 3150 was presented with the Commander-in-Chief's National Recognition Award for Outstanding Buddy Poppy Promotional Program. This was one of only two post-level awards of the evening and 3150 was the only post recognized in this category. It was the second consecutive year John Lyon was honored with national recognition at the convention banquet.


