

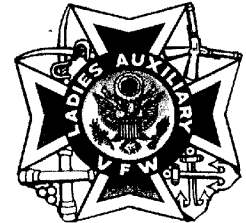

POW / MIA Recognition Day Friday, 21 September 2001

POW / MIA Presentation Table

As you entered the Mess this evening, you may have noticed a small table in the place of honor. It is set for one. Please let me explain. The military caste is filled with symbolism. This table is our way of symbolizing the fact that members of our profession of arms are missing from our midst. They are commonly called P.O.W or M.I.A. We call them "Brothers". They are unable to be with us this evening and so we remember them because of their incarceration.

This table set for one is small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone against his aggressors. Remember!!

The tablecloth is white, symbolizing the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms. Remember!!

The single rose displayed in a vase reminds us of the families and loved ones of our comrades-in-arms who keep the faith awaiting his return. Remember!!

The red ribbon tied so prominently to the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn on the lapel and breast of those who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand a proper accounting of our missing. Remember!!

A slice of lemon is on the bread plate to remind us of their bitter fate. Remember!!

There is salt upon the bread plate, symbolic of the families tears as they wait. Remember!!!

The glass is inverted--they cannot toast with us this night. Remember!!

The chair --- the chair is empty --- they are not here. Remember!!

From the Commander:

It's only come up once or twice but we care enough about you to desire you to get home safely without harm to yourself or others. I have already personally paid out of the Relief Fund for one member's cab ride home and have given the bartenders the interim authority to do so, as necessary, pending a request for a standing motion (to be discussed at September's meeting) to approve such payments. Have fun, frequent the post, and take care of each other, back-to-back.

Friday, September 21 is POW/MIA Recognition Day. This date is set aside annually to remember those men and women who were Prisoners of War or are still Missing in Action. More than 100,000 MIAs continue on the rolls of America's 20th century wars alone. Recent recovery actions have included Marine Raiders from Makin Island, B-24 and P-51 crewmen from France and Belgium, a WWII GI found in his foxhole in the former Heurtgen Forrest, and numerous remains, yet to be identified, from battlefields in North Korea. Because of a schedule conflict with the Department Fall Conference, I will be out of town, however, the Post will still be observing this important day of remembrance.

In closing I'd like to remind you all that just an hour or two per month is all that's required to assist the Post in any one of our myriad community service programs. I remain open to your suggestions, comments, and recommendations.

Gold Star Mother's Day Sunday 30 September 2001

Report of the 102nd VFW National Convention

More than 20,000 people arrived in Milwaukee with greeters welcoming us to the National Convention. The Virginia delegation was headquartered in the Hilton Hotel, across the street from the Convention Center, making it a delight to attend every business session, workshop, and event during the week long National Convention.

Saturday, August 18th was early morning registration and exhibit openings. Committee meetings and workshops were held; the National Council of Administration meeting completed the day.

On Sunday, the annual Memorial Service set the pace for a packed day of caucus and committee meetings. Between sessions, there was the VA Health Fair with booths to take blood tests, receive full eye exams, discuss every known condition known to the medical community and even register with the VA for benefits.

Everyone was waiting for the Opening Joint Session on Monday. Our glorious state of Virginia was well represented, watching and cheering as our 2000-2001 Virginia State Commander Early Ray Chappell walked across the stage to receive his All American hat.

During the Joint Session, the Honorable Anthony Principi, Secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs, received a standing ovation when he announced he is conducting a full review of the V.A. claims processing. There are currently over 600,000 pending applications with 53,000 claims more than a year old. Secretary Principi has been given President Bush's blessing to get this matter under control and he has vowed to make this happen.

With camera crews, secret service men talking into their suit pockets and dogs sniffing everyone passing by, we knew the President of the United States was on his way to address the Convention.

President George W. Bush received a resounding VFW Convention greeting as he took center stage. He opened his remarks expressing sympathy in the loss of South Carolina Congressman Floyd Spence. The President went on to remind us of how time flies. He said he had been with us just a year ago, minus one day. But since then, he has had a change of address. The audience responded in uproarious laughter.

Some items he addressed received rousing applause. These included health care to military retirees, new health care facilities, 6 new centers for Parkinson's, 41 new outpatient clinics, and the WWII Memorial in D.C. He ended by saying, "*America does not seek to produce more generations of war veterans; we are a peaceful nation, but we'll always need the commitment and courage and honor that we find in our veterans. Those who have worn the uniform have made a contribution, not just to the defense of our nation, but to the character of our nation. You've given your best to America and in so many ways, you are the best that is in America.*"

Retired Army General Wesley K. Clark, commander of NATO forces during the 1999 Kosovo Bombing campaign, was presented with the Dwight David Eisenhower Award before addressing the 2600 attendees at the National Banquet. He received a warm reception when he concluded by saying, "*Your country needs you and so does the world.*"

Tuesday saw workshops and business sessions kick into high gear.

There was hot debate on the floor of the convention on some proposed changes to the National By-Laws. VFW delegates approved the establishment of a Men's Auxiliary to the VFW. The amendment passed by voice vote, although the final tally was close. If Post members choose to have a men's auxiliary for their Post, they must approve it by a two-thirds majority, according to the amendment's wording. Eligibility is limited to husbands, widowers, fathers, sons, and stepsons of eligible VFW members. Prospective members of a men's auxiliary must be at least 16 years old. Men eligible for membership in the VFW shall not be eligible for membership in the Men's Auxiliary.

Also approved was the national dues increase for annual members. Effective January 1, 2002, the national organization dues shall be \$8.50 per annum. This represents a \$3.00 increase over current dues.

There were two hotly debated amendments that were both rejected. The life membership fee increase was defeated on the floor of the convention by voice vote of the delegates.

The other amendment that received a lot of debate on the floor and was the only one that went to a roll call vote was the amendment to remove the citizenship requirement for membership in the VFW and it, too, was defeated.

I just wanted to let you know of some of the key resolutions and proposed changes. If you are interested in a full accounting of approved resolutions and changes to the National by-laws, you can check the National web site or check the upcoming VFW Magazine.

Tuesday was capped off with the Patriotic Rally. This is a parade of ALL the Departments, their Officers and their Color/Honor Guards marching in review for the VFW and Ladies Auxiliary National Officers. Young ladies from National Home and the National Poppy Girl entertained, as did Barbara Fairchild and her husband Roy Morris, country music entertainers. The evening ended with fireworks INSIDE the Convention Center.

Wednesday and Thursday continued with business sessions and workshops. Of course, some of the fun is seeing the VIPs that attend our National Convention as speakers or as recipients of special awards. Special VIPs included: Rep. Steve Buyer (R-Ind.), Mayor of Milwaukee John O. Norquist, National Security Adviser Condoleezza Rice, Wisconsin Gov. Scott McCallum, former Miss America Heather French-Henry and her husband Kentucky Lt. Governor Stephen L. Henry, M.D., former ambassador to Vietnam Douglas "Pete" Peterson, the Navy's first black master deep-sea diver Carl Brashear, country music star Travis Tritt, Supreme Commander of the Military Order of the Cooties Kenneth Cole, Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Army Gen. Henry H. Shelton, executive director of the American Battle Monuments Commission Kenneth Pond, Rep. Ron Kind (D-Wis.), Mark Van Wagoner of KKDS radio in Salt Lake City, USO President John H. Tilelli, Jr., television star Dick Van Patten, and Lindsey Liberatore and Gillian Linmann, Voice of Democracy and Youth Essay award winners, just to name a few. Long time employee and close friend of ours, Vern Pall, from the Kansas City National HQ office was presented an award for outstanding service as he prepares to retire. You may not recognize the name but if you look at the masthead of your VFW magazine, his name is synonymous with the photos, stories and coverage of events reported in our excellent publication.

For the Ladies Auxiliary, 25 Past National Presidents were in attendance and honored for their work. Many honors were collected by the Virginia Department of the Ladies Auxiliary. In keeping count, we received 15 National awards for programs during 2000-2001. How proud we can be of our Virginia leaders.

One must never lose sight that this is a WORKING convention on all levels. Friday finished with the election of officers and the installation of Commander-in-Chief James N. Goldsmith and National President Diana Stout for 2001-2002.

While Commander John Gwizdak addressed President Patricia Jankowski and our Ladies Auxiliary, he left saying he never apologized for being in war. Through his service he was given what he called "a gift that not everyone has the opportunity to receive – to join the greatest veterans organization in the world; the V.F.W." His final words to our Auxiliary were, "*May you continue to be just who you are.*"

Departing veterans, their families and friends stood with suitcases in hand, each sharing the same departing message: See you at the 103rd National Convention August 24-30, 2002, at the Opryland Hotel, Nashville, Tennessee.

"Ya'll come back, now, ya' hear?"

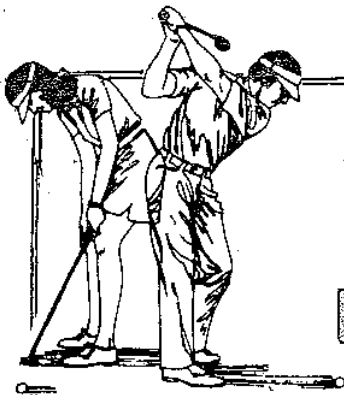

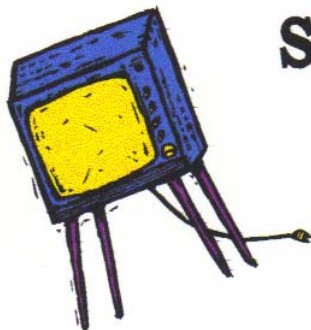
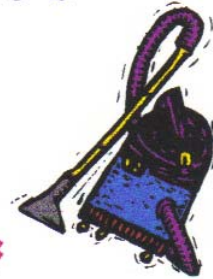
