VFW National Home for Children turns 81; Awareness Week is 19 - 25 March

Established in 1925, the VFW National Home for Children was created as a home for widows and orphans of deceased World War I veterans, but has grown to encompass other families in crisis. The National Home is a private, non-profit, licensed residential child care agency created to care for the developmental, social and spiritual needs of the children and families of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Ladies Auxiliary. The facility is not an orphanage, but a neighborhood of custom homes, service buildings and recreational land administered by a highly devoted staff and fully integrated into its surrounding community. More than 2,000 people have lived at the National Home during its 81 years of service.

The Campus is a neighborhood of more than 70 buildings on a 70-acre main campus. The Home includes 629 total acres including farmland and wooded areas. Facilities include 38 brick houses, Community Center, Guest Lodge, Chapel, Nursery/Daycare, museum, fire barn, greenhouse, maintenance and administration buildings.

Children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of VFW and Ladies Auxiliary members whose parents are deceased, disabled, or need assistance providing care are eligible to live at the National Home. Services are also available for families of active-duty military servicemen and women who can not provide adequate care through their approved family plan.

The VFW National Home for Children is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization supported solely by contributions from private individuals and organizations. For example, VFW 3150 makes a \$50 donation in the memory of each of our deceased members at the time of their death and Ladies Auxiliary 3150 also makes yearly donations. Saving Campbell's labels is a form of donation in kind. Post 3150 has a drop box where labels are collected and then sent to the National Home. Some out of town John Lyon members even mail their labels to the post. See page later in this newsletter for which labels to save. The post will also have a cash donation jar available during Awareness Week, 19 - 25 March.

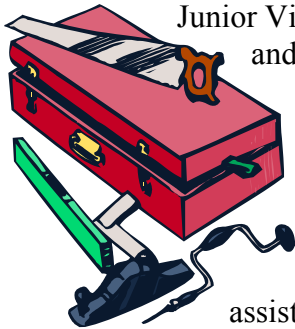

From the John Lyon Past...

From the archives of *The Washington Post*, 14 March 1945:

“Dugan Heads VFW Post in Arlington

“Dan A. Dugan has been elected post commander of the John Lyon Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, of Arlington, it was announced yesterday.

“Dugan, a graduate of Washington-Lee High School and a student at Corcoran School of Fine Arts, enlisted in the United States Navy in July 1942, and served on active duty until January of last year, when he was discharged for physical disability.

“While serving in the Navy, Dugan spent 18 months overseas in the European-African-Middle East theater of operations, where he was a member of the headquarters company, United States Naval Forces, Europe. He is now employed at the United States post office in Arlington.

Other newly elected officers who will be installed with Commander Dugan in April, are Henry M. Haney, senior vice commander; John P. Reardon, junior vice commander; Emil C. Krahnke, quartermaster; Austin J. Matthews, adjutant; Howard C. Handy, chaplain; Clarence H. McCarthy, sergeant; Charles W. Mucks, jr., officer of the day; James C. Buchanan, George W. Dalby and Paul A. Hill, trustees.”

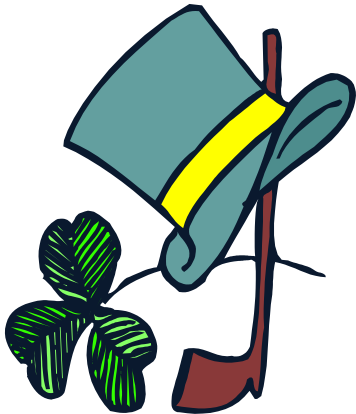
